

E1 ABDOMINAL PAIN

KEY QUESTIONS	PRE ARRIVAL INSTRUCTIONS
Nausea or Vomiting?	Turn Patient on thier left side
Any Bleeding? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rectal or vaginal Bleeding? • Vomiting blood? 	Advise Responders If Vomiting Blood - DO NOT dispose of it.
Associated Chest, Jaw or arm Pain?	Refer to Chest Pain Card .
Location of pain and duration?	Leave Patient in position of comfort.

INCIDENT TYPE	
Abdominal Pain	ABD F
Associated Chest, Jaw, Arm, or Upper Abdominal Pain	CHEST F
Pregnancy related abdominal pain	PREG F

SECONDARY QUESTIONS	PRE ARRIVAL INSTRUCTIONS
Associated Medical History?	Dont give the patient anything to eat or drink.

IF ANYTHING CHANGES CALL BACK

Common Causes

- Aneurysm
- Appendicitis
- Bowel Obstruction
